Meeting called to order: 6:03 p.m. by Mandy G.

Approval of November meeting minutes: Motion to approve by Kellie D., 2nd by Nicole D. Minutes unanimously approved.

Elementary Report – Jon Wennstrom

- iReady math for K 6 currently happening
- Planning for a Winter field day (at Buchanan) in February if there's snow
- Currently planning for March is Reading Month
- Kindness challenge
- Will be doing self-care work for both staff and students with tips from MEMSPA like "gratitude" journals

Superintendent's Report – Andrea Oquist

- Updated protocols regarding COVID were sent to parents
- Andrea M. suggested that the district make close contact & vaccinated student protocol clearer. There seems to be a lot of confusion regarding this for parents.
- The notification process will still happen although it may just be through one format
- COVID dashboard is continuing to be updated daily
- District is planning to eventually keep all COVID notifications in one place in the future instead of constant emails.
- Blessing Bags (about 2500) given to LPS and Clarenceville staff from Rosedale Gardens Presbyterian Church as part of the Livonia Kindness Initiative. The staff will also be given a pizza lunch in February.
- Emerson, Cooper, Coolidge, Kennedy, and Randolph are scheduled to have air conditioning and Kitchen renovations this summer. 6 other schools are scheduled for air conditioning placement only.
- Mrs. Oquist would like to have the district DEI committee do a presentation at Council's next meeting.
- Next BOE meeting will be recognizing Robotics and a high school state championship swimmer who is also the first female on the boy's hockey team. They will also recognize the members of BOE for BOE month.

- Debbie Y. asked where we stand on staff shortages. Mrs. Oquist stated that they are constantly monitoring the situation and they are able to fill the gaps so far.
 Transportation is the hardest hit right now and there is also a strong need for paras. The sub shortage was significant the past few weeks. This week was better. There was an uptick in COVID cases after the break and subs were not coming back right after the break so there was less availability.
- The district is not planning to use people from other positions to cover absences. They have good back up plans.
- Chris C. asked what the response amount was for the ESSER survey. Mrs. Oquist stated there were 2400 responses, primarily parents. Two major points stood out to be important: Social/Emotional support for students and more Academic supports during the year for students. The district has an initial plan for this, but they can modify it if needed over the next 6 months.

Secondary Report – Dan Willenborg

- Will be ending the semester with unit assessments instead of traditional final exams.
- High schools have 3 half days next week, Middle schools have 2 half days and 1 day off
- New semester starts February 1st. February 2nd POC day (K 12). Students report in the afternoon.
- Next week is in-school preview night at the 3 High Schools for 8th grade students. It will be staggered to help eliminate over crowding
- Winter sports is in full swing
- Parent Teacher Conferences will be virtual again. March 3rd for M.S. and March 10th for H.S.
- There is a change in date for commencements. Frankin will be Thurs June 2nd @ 7pm, Stevenson will be Fri June 3rd @ 7pm, and Churchill will be Sun June 5th @ 12pm.
