Elementary Report – Jon Wennstrom

- Transition to online learning delayed one day at Buchanan due to power outage
- Getting positive feedback from parents so far about online learning process

Secondary Report - Daniel Willenborg

- Expects an announcement regarding special education students in regards to online learning before Thanksgiving
- Parent Teacher conferences today and tomorrow for high schools. Parents received links for conferences. Still a learning curve for this.
- Microsoft Teams is what was used for conferences. Missed conferences due to technology issues can be rescheduled. Robb D. offered support if needed in order to help parents navigate Microsoft Teams.
- Athletics postponed by MHAS. Football could finish in December if we are able to return on December 7th as planned. All competitions suspended until after winter break. Spring sports and any tournaments may be delayed as well.
- Kellie D. suggests more emphasis for athletes not having after parties, team dinners, etc., which were happening. Mr. Willenborg stated that the district has sent multiple communications in regards to this.

Superintendent Report - Andrea Oquist

- District continually monitoring COVID numbers and consulting with the city, county, and MDH. The pause in f2f was due to rapidly increasing numbers in the city.
- Over 450 students have been in close contact quarantine
- The district is hopeful to bring back special education students earlier; replicating the safe start September model.

- Contact tracing is being done internally within the district due to the county being overwhelmed. It is being done by Dr. Taiariol, Katie Dodge, Keith McDonald, and Nakia Bright.
- Parents have been doing a good job of respecting confidentiality when it comes to positive cases and are complying well with contact tracing.
- LPS is following the close contact definition of the MDH even though the CDC recently updated theirs. A difference of consecutive vs cumulative minutes.
- Jackson Center as well as all child care programs in Livonia are governed by LARA and must adhere to the CDC's updated definition of close contact.
