<u>District Report – DEIB Update</u> – Theresea O'Brien

- They gave an overview of the DEI committee, which added a B for Belonging in 2023
- In 18/19, LPS created a committee of staff throughout the district to determine if people felt welcomed and valued. It was a volunteer group.
- In 19/20, LPS held trainings and hired a part-time facilitator who traveled around the district. Unfortunately, she left LPS for a job with Wayne RESA. Common definitions for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion were created along with school climate and culture goals.
- In the Spring of 2023, the committee focused on "How do we make this part of every school?" and created a definition for Belonging.
- In 24/25, LPS circled back to each school's goals to find out what is working and what needs to be changed. These goals are part of the school improvement team. This school year is also focused on getting answers to grow and shape the progress that the district has made.
- Council can have one point person for DEIB information. That person will share information with the school PTA groups.

Livonia 75 Committee - Stacy Jenkins

- Presentation of the Livonia 75 Time capsule project. Stacy created a flyer to explain the idea. Council will share with all the PTAs and ask them to participate if they want. Stacy will create a Google form for the PTAs to fill out so the district can keep track of where all the time capsules are located and when they will be dug up.
